Make sure the one you pick meets the basics of a good web hosting company. The monthly costs should be reasonable, 24x7 technical support, guaranteed up times, web building tools that are easy to use. Some other things you might want to consider, depending on your type of home based business, is email accounts, newsletter creator, auto responders, home statistics, a domain name that you own. If you write down your web hosting requirements first it will speed up your analyze time in finding the right web host for your business.

After you develop the contents of your website, you'll need to publish it to the Internet. Most hosting companies provide step-by-step instructions on how to publish your website to the Internet.
